

Acacia Scarf

I came up with the idea for this scarf as a project to fight boredom on a very long flight back from Tasmania to England, I managed to finish making it minutes before landing! I named it Acacia Scarf because the colour reminds me of the many acacia trees I saw on the holiday.

Crochet stitches used:

YO: Yarn Over
DC: Double Crochet
HT: Half Treble
HTC: Half Treble Cluster
CH: Chain



Pattern Details:

Yarn: Four balls of Jo Sharp Classic DK wool (98m/50g, shade Venice)
Hook: 4.5mm
Tension: 14 sts = 10cm/4"; 2 rows HT and 2 rows HTC = 5cm/2"
Size: 12.5cm x 188cm (5" x 74")

Special Instructions:

Half Treble Cluster:

YO, Insert hook through next stitch, YO, draw loop through stitch. YO, draw yarn through first two loops on hook, YO, insert hook through same stitch, YO, draw loop through stitch, YO, draw yarn through all four loops on hook.

HTC openwork:

CH 2, *HTC in next stitch, CH 1, skip one stitch*.
Repeat from * to * ending row with HTC in last stitch.

Scarf Pattern:

Chain 236.

Two rows HT, working first HT in to 3rd ch from hook.

Two rows Half treble cluster openwork.

Repeat these four rows two more times and finish with two rows of HT.

One row DC at each narrow end of the scarf to create a neat edge.

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
